The word "pragmatic" rather than "practical" in the title reveals that Kant believed that his Anthropology went beyond this purpose. Presumably the second main part, "Anthropology Characteristic," is to be understood along these lines, particularly with regard to the discussion of individual character, but also with regard to characters of the sexes, and of peoples.
